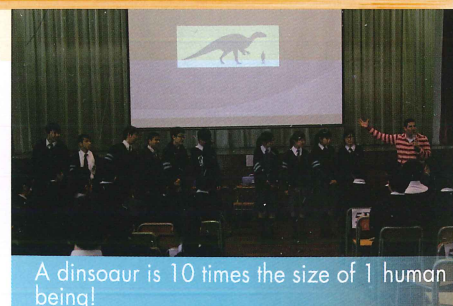

Pre-Drama Workshop

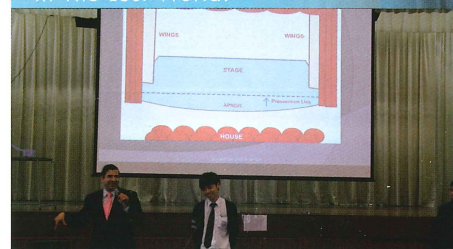

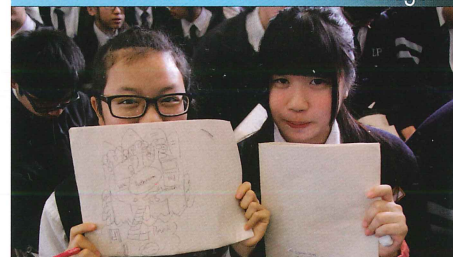
A dinosaur is 10 times the size of 1 human being!

Jane: Look! Speak of the devil. Here comes Bob.



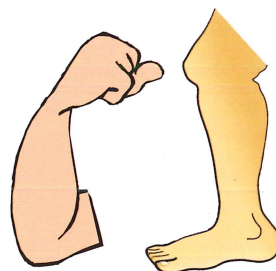
2 Cost an arm and a leg
