Be Avid, Babbling and Creative! 中二中三詩歌創作班

Have you ever thought of writing an English poem yourself? This year, 13 S2-3 students ventured into the era of writing English poems by joining Poetry Circle, a free afterschool elite programme held twice every cycle.

The Circle aims to induce a love of English among aspiring language learners in terms of PIEproficiency, interest and experience. For P, students are encouraged to read aloud classic poems in duo and class. For I, our sessions are infused with up-to-date local news about typhoons and wild boars. For E, our young poets endeavor to write poetry, which ranges from shape poems to Japanese Haiku. Each poet has his or her very own poetry portfolio to keep track of all their creative works.



My shape poem is called Rain. I used personification extensively in my poem e.g. "Rain is like a child. When he is sad he cries heavily. When he is afraid, he will hide behind the sun."



I created a Japanese Haiku poem about penguins. Haiku is a traditional, structured and short poem. We have to make sure the three lines stick to the rule of 5/7/5 syllable scheme. In my poem, I compared penguins with geese as they are both adorable in my eyes.



Miss Wong asked us to create a poem after Typhoon Kompasu had hit HK last year. So I created Cats and Dogs, in which I described how unlucky students felt at school when the Observatory issued a black rainstorm warning.
